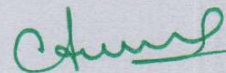

Arrival of the members:

In connection with the above visit, Prof. D Thukaram had reached Nashik around 5:30 pm on 6-9-2011 and all other members reached Nashik by late night/early hours of 7-9-2011.

1st Day 7-9-2011:

All the members met at the hotel during morning break-fast and commenced visit to the college. The team reached the college by 9:15 am. The college principal, college trust members received the visiting team. Prof. D Thukaram, had meeting with the team members separately and discussed about the tentative schedule of the program. Later the team moved to the presentations hall. At the outset the team members and college trust members, senior faculty members were introduced.

With the help of power point presentations, first the secretary of the trust made presentation about brief history of the trust, its policies and developmental activities. The principal made detailed presentation indicating the organizational structure of the management, its vision and mission. He gave the details of the infrastructure, teaching and non-teaching staff members, curriculum activities, students admission, academic results and other activities. During these presentations the team members have noted several points and sought clarifications from the principal and college management members.

After the presentations, all the team members visited the various central facilities, such as central library, workshop, physics and chemistry laboratories and canteen facilities. During these visits members noted certain points and clarified with the concerned staff members.

After working lunch, the members visited to respective departments. During this time Prof. D Thukaram verified various documents pertaining to the college land, governing body activities, teaching and non-teaching staff recruitments, salary payments, insurance etc.

The visiting committee had meetings with first year, second year and final year students of various programmes, teaching and non-teaching staff members, and collected their feedback on academic activities, management support for their up gradation of qualifications, salary structure, medical facilities, promotional policies etc. During these meetings the response of the students and staff was very satisfactory.

In the evening all the committee members met in a closed door meeting room and had exchange of their views and observations. There were discussions and preliminary assessment notes on the work-sheets.

2nd Day 8-9-2011:

All the members met at the hotel during morning break-fast and commenced visit to the college. The team reached the college by 9:00 am. The team members moved to respective programme departments. During this time, Prof. D Thukaram further verified documents on industry interactions, medical facilities, transport arrangements etc. He also had detailed discussions with principal, visited staff rooms, class rooms, laboratories and interacted with some students and staff members.

After working lunch, the visiting committee had meetings with group of parents, industry employers and student alumni. During these meetings the parents narrated about the developments in college, infrastructure, teaching staff, academic results, additional support provided to weaker students and excellent discipline maintained at the college. The employers expressed their satisfaction with the students working in their industry. They mentioned that the students coming out from this college are well disciplined and have confidence to take up new tasks. Most of the alumni are pursuing higher studies, they expressed satisfaction of studying at this college.

In the evening all the committee members met in a closed door meeting room for preparation of the reports. All the members discussed point by point on general institutional aspects. The specific programme members also discussed among themselves and prepared their work sheets and completed the final reports in all respects. The team returned to the hotel by evening 8:30 pm.

3rd Day 9-9-2011:

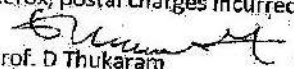
In the morning all the team members (except Dr. Buta Singh Sidhu) reached the college for the exit meeting. The meeting is attended by the college trust management members, principal, head of the departments and some senior faculty members. The exit meeting started around 9:00 am. At the outset, Prof. D Thukaram, chairman visiting committee, briefed about the format of exit meeting and gave oral information on general strengths and weaknesses observed by the visiting committee. Programme wise expert committee members also conveyed the strengths and weaknesses of respective diploma programmes under review. The visiting committee then separated giving opportunity to college management to discuss among its members to exercise the option of withdrawing any specific programme(s) from accreditation process. After a while the college trust management members, principal, head of the departments and some senior faculty members returned to the meeting. The principal of the college informed the visiting committee that they wish to proceed with the accreditation process of all the four programmes and do not withdraw any programme. Finally the meeting concluded around 10:00 am with thanks by the trust president. The committee members returned to the hotel.

Departure of the members:

On 9-9-2011, Dr. Buta Singh Sidhu, left the hotel early morning proceeding to Mumbai for his return journey. Prof. Uma Bhattacharya stayed for some time at the hotel, while other members, Prof. D Thukaram, Dr. Arul Arasu Maragabandhu, Prof. T G Basavaraju, Prof. T V Gopal, Prof. V C Ravichandran and Prof. Asit Kumar Datta left the hotel around 10:45 am proceeding towards Mumbai for their respective return journey.
